


The team amassed a seven and three record with a rousing win over arch-rival West Chester 32-0 in the Annual Thanksgiving Day Tilt.


tackle. Receiving Honorable Mention were Guard Dave Irete, Fullback John Conti and Quarterback Bob Lee.

Conti Hero As Bulldogs Whip Radnor Rivals Big Fullback Scores Three Times, One on 82-Yard Run, in 33-6 Victory

Fullback John Conti was the hero as Tredyffrin-Easttown High hung one on its neighborhood rival, Radnor High, by a 33-6 score, in their annual game under the lights on Teamer Field in Berwyn last night.

Conti scored three of the five touchdowns which gave the Bulldogs their clear margin of superiority. His most sensational effort was an 82-yard romp in the second quarter. Prior to that he had scored from the one at the end of a 67yard T-E march.

To round out his performance, the burly senior skirted end for 10 yards and a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Ably aiding and abetting Conti in the point productions were Frank Della Penna and Bob Hughes, Coach Ernie Meyer's capable halfbacks. Della Penna raced 25 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter. Conti had a hand in this touchdown through the interception of a pass to gain possession at the enemy's 40-yard line. Conti carried to the 30 and Della Penna to the 25 to set-up the touchdown scamper.

Hughes got into the scoring column with the last touchdown of the game. It came on an interception which put Hughes in the clear for a 40-yard ramble into the pay-off zone.

Della Penna added three extra-points during the game, two on placement kicks and one on a plunge.

The Bulldogs now have a 3-1 record, having defeated Bridgeport, St. Matthew's and Radnor. Their one defeat was at the hands of Conshohocken, September 29 by a score of 12-13.

MARGIN OF VICTORY BIGGEST SINCE 1915 *Frank Della Penna Leads Attack* Bulldogs Net Five Touchdowns Against Warriors

High-powered Tredyffrin-Easttown High scored in every period as it rolled up a 32-0 score against West Chester High School in their annual Thanksgiving morning grid finale before nearly 5,000 fans on Teamer Field at Berwyn.

All of the starting backs figured in point-production for the T-E Bulldogs along with a sub halfback who performed sensationally in the final period.

Della Penna Tops

Frank Della Penna, six-foot, 190-pound senior fullback, who scored the first of five T-E touchdowns, led an attack which gave the Main Liners an edge of 400 yards to 111 gained from scrimmage. The first time Coach Meyer's eleven gained possession, it marched 45 yards for a touchdown. Bob Lee intercepted a pass at his own 40 and returned it to the Warrior 45. Della Penna went into action with a series of line thrusts that netted first downs at the 31, the 20 and the 10. From the ten, Della Penna smashed to the three. John Conti and Della Penna gained to the one in two more plays and then Big Frank crashed over.

Conti Scores Second

Della Penna returned a punt from the West Chester 45 to the 21, setting off a scoring drive. Conti smashed to a first down at the nine. After Della Penna moved the ball to the three, Conti crashed over tackle for the touchdown.

Rosato sliced through the right side of the West Chester line and went 50 yards to score.

Lee Catches Defense Off Guard

T-E began to march early in the fourth quarter, moving from its own 25 to the West Chester 45 in two first downs. At this point, Quarterback Lee, who had not carried the ball previously, caught the West Chester defense off guard on a bootleg play that sent him scampering around his own right end and into the clear for a 45-yard scoring jaunt. Della Penna raced around end for the PAT.


ChesMont League All Stars Announced
