Ernie Meyers was the Head Coach of the 1950 football team. His assistants were Earl Metzler and Bob Keehn. Coach Meyer became Head Coach in 1945 when he moved to Berwyn with his family. Coach Metzler joined him in 1947, and Coach Keehn became an assistant in 1948.

Highlights of the year were the building and dedicating of the new football field and the 6-0 run at the beginning of the season. A low-light of the year was Occi Vause's broken leg in the Pottstown game on October 28th. From that point the Bulldogs lost three games by a total of 14 points.

Despite the fact the Occi was unable to play for the remainder of the season, he received Honorable Mention on the All Ches-Mont team

Teamer Field At Berwyn To Seat 3,200 To Be Dedicated To Memory of Ex-Coach At Game with Lansdale

Seating accommodations for 3,200 fans are provided at the new Athletic Field which Tredyffrin-Easttown High will dedicate as its 1950 football team opens against Lansdale High tomorrow evening.

The new field, adjacent to the High School building in central Berwyn, will be called Teamer Field. Thus the school will honor the memory of a former Principal Paul S. Teamer, who was also football coach at the school from 1913 to 1931. Mr. Teamer died some years ago.

The brief dedication ceremony will precede the game. Assistant Coach Robert Keehn will officiate. W. G. Latch of the School Board, Lawrence S. Roneya member of the Athletic Council, Hobson Wagner-Superintendent of Schools and Wallace Brey- the Principal, will speak. Music will be furnished by the school band under the direction of Stanley Gray.

Well sodded and located where drainage is excellent, the new field is one of the best in Chester County. Permanent stands provide seats for 3,200. The lights are also permanent and stand 65 feet above the playing field. They have a lighting capacity of 90,000 watts.

The T-E coach, Ernie Meyer, has been working hard to get a good starting combination. Today it appears that Charley Hamilton and Fred Ballard will

start as ends, Bob Lenker and Lou Alleva as tackles, Dave DeRafelo and Charley Hughes as guards, and Bill Walton at center. Joe Lucas, Pete Melchiorre, Henry Ginnona, Tom Ramsay, "Funzy" Alleva and Richard Patton will alternate on the line.

In the backfield Coach Meyer expects to use Occi Vause as quarterback, Dick Collins, Don Rosato, Frank Della Penna and Norm Natale as halfbacks and John Conti as fullback.

Collins Tabs Three As T-E Gains Verdict

Halfback Leads Attack Which Whips Conshohocken Rivals by 38-7 Margin

Halfback Dick Collins scored three touchdowns as Tredyffrin-Easttown High ran up a 38-7 count against Conshohocken High at Teamer Field in Berwyn, last night for their third straight victory of the young 1950 football campaign.

The protégés of Coach Ernest Meyer scored in every period for their decisive verdict.

Collins scored on a 10-yard off-tackle slant in the opening stanza, a 10-yard run around right end in the second and another 10-yard off-tackle smash in the final period.

The Bulldogs drew first blood when fullback Johnny Conti smashed 12 yards on a line thrust to climax an early march from the Conshohocken 30. Occi Vause booted the extra point.

A few minutes later, Conshy tied it up in a march from its own 20-yard line.

On the second play after a kick-off which followed, Dick Collins took a pitch-out and went 57 yards to the Conshy 10. On the next play, he went over for the TD.

Opening the second quarter, a Conshohocken

punt was blocked by guard Charley Hughes and recovered by him within 10 yards of the pay-off zone. Collins circled right end and went all the way to score. Again Vause converted with a placement.






T-E Bulldogs Handed Jolt

Remember That Tie

Last fall, West Chester was a pre-game favorite but was held to a 6-all tie by the determined protégés of Coach Ernest Meyer. The Main Liners won in 1948 by a 7-6 margin. West Chester's last win in the series was a 14-6 decision in 1947.

The loss of veteran quarterback Occi Vause with a broken leg in the Pottstown game has left Coach Meyer with 135-pound Bob Lee as his probable signal-caller. He will probably go into action with Norm Natale and Dick Collins as halfbacks and burly John Conti as fullback. Natale may be shifted to

quarterback, giving over the halfback spot to Frank Della Penna, a 190-pound lad, who has distinguished himself in several games as a break-away runner. Wilson Reason, a 175-pound linesmasher, is also set for action as a halfback.

Collins Is Key Back

Key man of the T-E attack is Collins, who stands five-feet-six and weight only 135 pounds. His speed and ability to get started on a dime has made him the most-potent ground gainer for the Bulldogs throughout their season. It was Collins who sparked the drive which gave T-E a draw with the Warriors last Thanksgiving Day.

Bulldog Line

On the line, Coach Meyer has veteran Fred Ballard and Charley Hamilton as his starting ends, with Randy McAusland as a capable replacement. Hamilton is the place-kicking specialist who goes after extra-points for the Bulldogs.

With Lou Alleva, a 235-pounder, and Guy Mitchell, a 175-pounder, to alternate at one tackle berth, T-E has Joe Lucas, a 190-pounder to start on the other side of the line. His top replacement is Bob Lenker, who stands six-two and tips the beam at 210.

Dave DeRafelo, an All-County Selection as a sophomore in 1948, and a dependable performer last fall, will be at one guard post and Charley Hughes, who also had varsity experience in 1949, at the other. Both are "60-minute men" at their posts.

Bill Walton, who weighs in at a scrappy 155, is a steady anchor at the center spot. *D.L.N.* 11/22/50

WARRIORS WIN ANNUAL TURKEY DAY CONTEST

The annual Thanksgiving Game between perennial rivals – West Chester Warriors and Tredyffrin-Easttown Bulldogs – was played on the West Chester High School field before a spirited crowd. West Chester took home the Powell Cup, the trophy that the winner of the game possesses for the school year, with a 19-2 victory.

The Warriors saved their best game for the last, and it was good enough to earn a clear-cut decision against Coach Ernest Meyer's T-E Bulldogs. A "gift" safety put the invaders ahead momentarily in the second period but they made no serious bid of their own to score. Their best penetration took them no deeper than the Warrior 35, and they were across midfield only three times during the morning. The "gift" came as a bad pass from the Warrior center to his quarterback left the signal caller to fall on the ball in the end zone to save a chance for a T-E recovery and touchdown.

The Main Liners fought back courageously after each score, but when they would put together a series of first downs to march down the field, "something" bad would happen. They would fail to make short yardage on a fourth down, or they would have the ball batted down and grabbed by the opponent.
