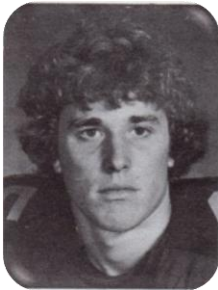
Conestoga fullback Eric Maslowsky scored the only touchdown in the game on Conestoga's second possession after a bad snap on a punt started a string of errors for the young Patriot team midway through the first quarter.

Conestoga's second score, still in the first period, came after an even more bizarre Patriot miscue.

After Conestoga had been stopped cold in its tracks by a very tough defense, the Pioneer punt hit a Great Valley player in the back of the helmet enabling the Pioneers to recover the "fumble" and kick a 28-yard field goal. That was to be the end of the Conestoga offensive threat for the rest of the day.

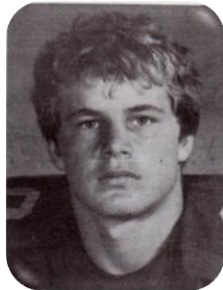
The Pioneer defensive line brother duo of Peter and Paul Novelli surely earned some respect from Patriot backs as they were in on most tackles at the line.

Ironman of the day was Conestoga quarterback and linebacker Mark Miller. While his total offensive stats were shy of Bradfield's his defense was spectacular.



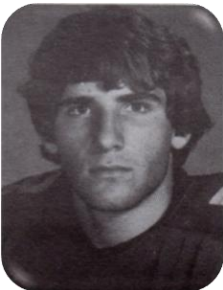

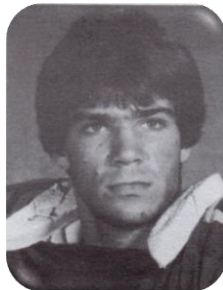

# Pioneers Fall to Pennridge

Harry Gicking was the Conestoga High football team's defensive coordinator for the last three years, so in his defensive heart of hearts he had to be pleased with the Pioneers' performance at Pennridge Saturday night.

But Gicking is the head football coach at Conestoga now, and must concern himself with other niceties--like scoring points. The Pioneers' output in the first two weeks of the season, including Saturday's 5-2 loss, had Gicking wondering what he can do to start lighting up the scoreboard.

Conestoga's defense certainly was aggressive against the Rams, limiting the Bux-Mont League squad to 165 yards, including only 11 through the air. In two weeks, the Pioneer defense has given up a

grand total of three points--Jim Grass' 26-yard field goal Saturday--while scoring four of its own on a pair of safeties.

After scoring one touchdown and totaling 120 yards in a season-opening 9-2 triumph over Great Valley, the Pioneers managed only 111 yards Saturday. Conestoga quarterback Mark Miller was sacked seven times for losses of 40 yards, and the rushing attack netted eight yards on 33 carries.

Even though the offense had problems, it looked like Conestoga might be able to steal away with a victory. The Pioneers held Pennridge to two first downs in the opening half and went into the locker room with a 2-0 lead.

Conestoga didn't cross midfield the rest of the game, with the only mild threat coming when Miller hit Jim Flynn with a 28-yard pass to the Pioneer 49.

But Gicking quickly pointed out that he wasn't making excuses. And none were needed for the defense, which was led by Miller, Maslowski, Chip Brown and defensive lineman Jon Kagen.

"They executed very well," Gicking said. "We have some very aggressive boys."



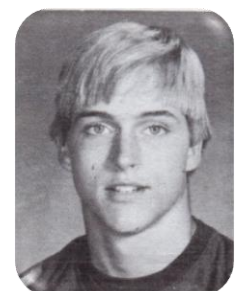

# **Madison, Kerr Key Pioneer Victory**

*"You have to be a football hero to get along with the beautiful girls."* High schools have changed a great deal since that was written, but if it is still true, Conestoga's Todd Madison and Jamie Kerr should have a banner week starting on Monday.

The two Pioneer sophomores, along with the defensive team, covered themselves with glory last night at Conestoga as the Pioneers opened their Central League campaign with a 7-0 victory over Haverford High.

Madison entered the game late in the third quarter and sparked an 11-play, 72-yard drive that lifted the Pioneers to victory. A 5-10, 215-pound running back, Madison carried the ball nine times picking up 39 yards finally punching over from the four with 7:35 to play in the fourth period.

"I was really tired when I got down near the goal line, but we had worked real hard and I just put my head down and ran," declared Madison. "I just told myself to get over and score. We are getting the offense down better every game, and the defense still is unscored on."

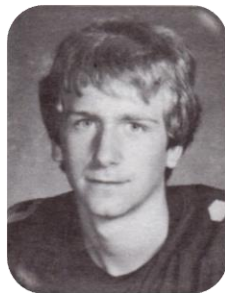
While Madison tallied the game winning touchdown, Kerr came through with a clutch 43-yard pass completion to keep the drive alive. The Pioneers had taken over the ball following a pass interception by Johnny Wallace, his second of the game. Conestoga moved the ball to the Fords' 40-yard line when a holding call set them back to their 45. Kerr faded back and hit Rich Blake for a first down at the Fords' 12.

"We are very happy with Jamie's performance," explained Conestoga coach Harry Gicking. "It is difficult for a sophomore to go out in his first home game, but we have a lot of confidence in him. He is well poised and mature and we know that he will have a great year."

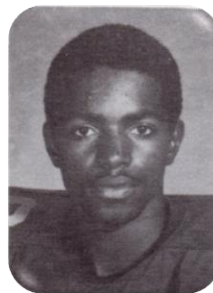
"Todd (Madison) is another sophomore and we knew that Todd had great ability and we are very happy with him," continued the coach. "Madison went in when Eric (Maslowsky) had trouble with his contact lens. It is nice to see a sophomore do well. We have not scored too many offensive points so far this year and so we have to try new people. Our offense did very well tonight. It is beginning to execute and it is nice to see the boys move the ball and score."



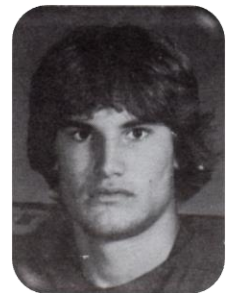

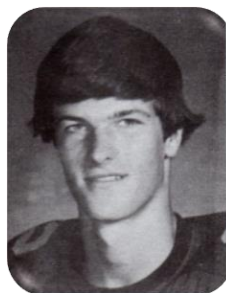
That time came Saturday at Ridley. After spotting Conestoga an early 3-0 lead the powerful Green

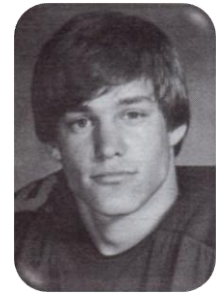

## Tough Pass Rush

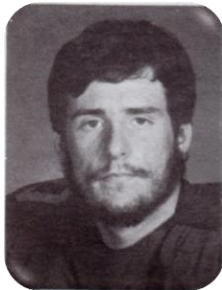

ground game of Springfield to 25 yards over the last two quarters.

The Pioneers did have rough going offensively all night but an interception by Mark Miller of a Stumpf pass on the opening play of the fourth quarter set up a tying score. One play after the interception, Miller took a handoff from quarterback John Conlan and burst 10 yards over the left side for the score. On the run Miller dropped the ball but it bounced back into his hands as he crossed the goal line. Scott Snyder added the extra point.

Conestoga coach Harry Gicking recognized the effort put forth by his club.

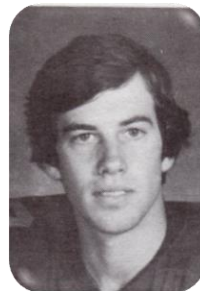
"I told them after the game they had nothing to be ashamed of," he said. "They played with all their heart and that's all we can ask them to do. They really came together in the second half."



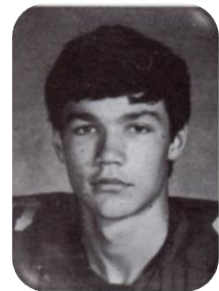

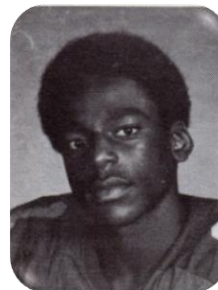

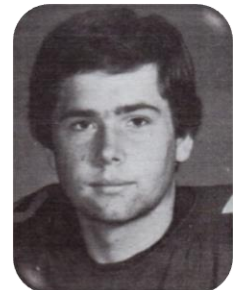

Saturday's loss 14-13 at Upper Darby was another example of just how bad things have been for the Pioneers this year.

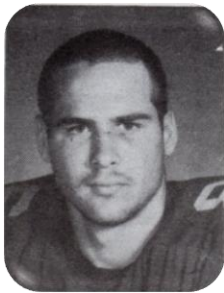

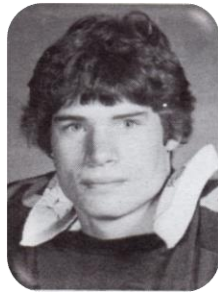

Conlan finished by hitting on 7-of-13 passes for 95 yards and the scoring toss to Murphy.



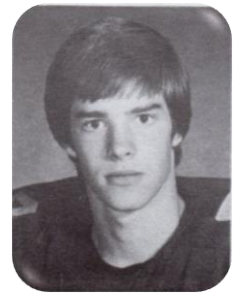

# **End of a Nightmare for Conestoga**

Harry Gicking's nightmare was in full swing.

It started two weeks ago when Springfield beat Conestoga 10-7 on a last-minute field goal. It resumed last Saturday when the Pioneers failed on a late two-point conversion and lost 14-13 to Upper Darby.

When the host Pioneers fell behind Lower Merion 12-0 in the first quarter last night, Conestoga's head football coach wondered if the nightmare would ever end.

"We didn't really have a chance to get started," Gicking said. "I told the team to buckle down."

The Pioneers listened. The defense trumped the Aces the rest of the way, the offense came alive on two long corner passes and Conestoga eked out a 14-12 Central League victory.

"But we rallied tonight as a team. We showed character. We showed class."

Most of all, they showed the ability to come back from a disastrous start. The Pioneers quickly dug a 6-0 hole as Lower Merion quarterback Anthony Horshaw dove over from the one to cap a six-play 46-yard drive.

Conestoga seemingly tied it in the first quarter as John Conlan hit Mark Murphy on a corner pattern for a TD, but a penalty negated the score. Seconds later, a bad snap forced Pioneer punter Eric Krohn into a hurried kick. Marty Coyle picked off the dying quail at the line of scrimmage and sprinted 63 yards down the sideline for a Lower Merion touchdown.

Conlan started the comeback by hitting Murphy on a 36-yard corner route with 4:43 left in the second quarter. After a holding penalty, Scott Snyder booted a 35-yard extra point to make it 7-6.

"Defensively we just broke down a few times," Lower Merion head coach Rogers Frassenel said.

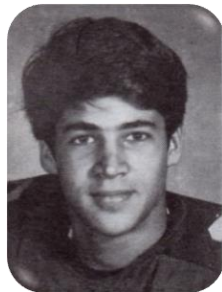
And Conlan helped break them down. The senior started the year as the third string quarterback, but has shown a first rate arm.

"John Conlan is throwing the heck out of the ball," Gicking said. "He's building confidence. He's getting tougher."

Conlan teamed with Murphy on another 36-yard corner in the third period, moving the Pioneers to the Aces' 15. Conestoga (2-3 league, 3-4 overall) scored the winning touchdown six plays later on a one-yard Conlan sneak, and Snyder added the extra point to make it 14-12.



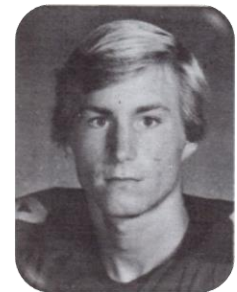

# Flat Pioneers Drop Game to Souderton

said after his squad fell to 3-5. "If you don't come ready to play, anybody can beat you."

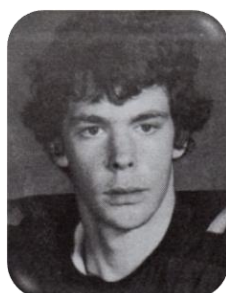

Souderton scored all of the points it needed on its first possession, driving 67 yards in 10 plays.

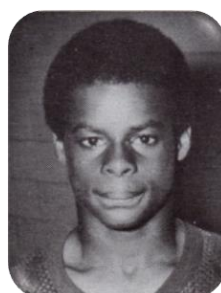

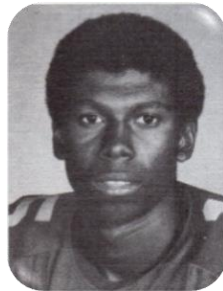
back with a safety when Conlan was sacked in the end zone.

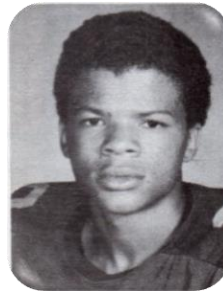
Conlan put the ball up 29 times for the Pioneers and completed 10 passes for 131 yards. Murphy caught five passes for 69 yards.

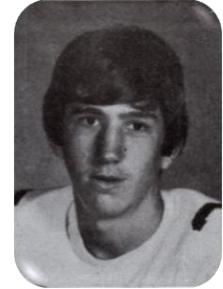

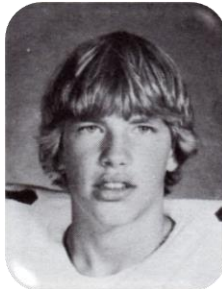

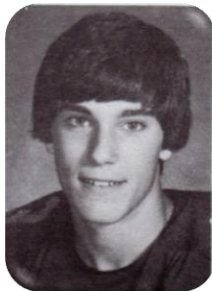
Szafranski, just a sophomore, had caught the Radnor line off guard by running a sweep on the first

# **Penalty Flag Mars Conestoga Win**

It's incredible just how much one tiny yellow flag can affect an otherwise splendid football game.

Yesterday at Conestoga, the Pioneers and Marple-Newtown played that splendid game. Then came the flag which turned a dramatic 8-7 Conestoga victory into one of those wins that will always have an asterisk beside it.

The Pioneers (who finished 4-6-1) and Tigers (4-7) had swapped late fourth quarter scores, but Conestoga's two-point conversion with 5:50 left made for the one-point edge. Marple, which had bullied its way to the game's first touchdown just 35 seconds earlier, looked ready to be stuffed away inside some turkey.

But instead of dissolving into so much cranberry sauce, the Tigers marched all the way to Conestoga's 18 on a crisp nine-play drive. The Pioneer defense had been a rock all afternoon.

Finally, on a third-and-four play, halfback Steve Coyne ran a sweep around right end which ended up

being broken field run to the left. The speedy Coyne got a jump on the pursuit, and when he whisked into the near corner of the endzone, it appeared to be the game-winner.

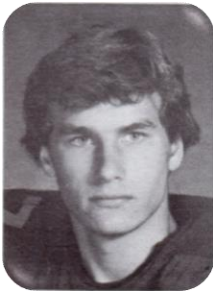
The moans on the Conestoga sideline, though, soon turned to cheers when Marple tackle Doug Sauder was flagged for a clip. Sauder, the Tiger's co-captain and best offensive lineman, was caught knocking down Pioneer cornerback Jim Flynn from behind.

All the screaming in the world would not have changed the penalty.

Conestoga coach Harry Gicking, who had every reason to smile after sophomore Eric Krohn had countered Barr's one-yard scoring run with a 77-yard TD reception, was able to remain diplomatic about a flag he knew could have gone either way.

"But I'm very happy we won. It was our last home game and our last game for the seniors, and we hung together as a team."

All that togetherness had been wasted, though, until Krohn's sprint down the far sideline and Rich Blake's subsequent catch on the point after.
