Mateer-Coached Paoli Team Chalks Up Another Victory

Former Berwyn High Coach Has Combination Clicking As of Old in 13-6 Triumph Over Sherwood A. C. Byassee and Colona Score

The Paoli Eagles, displaying plenty of evidence of the "Ken" Mateer coaching touch, registered a 13 to 6 victory over Sherwood A. C., of Philadelphia, at Green Tree School gridiron, Sunday afternoon.

Featuring powerful ground football of the brand which made Berwyn High teams outstanding during Mateer's regime there, the Eagles rolled to touchdowns in the first and third quarters. Each touchdown climaxed a drive from out past midfield. The old Mateer end sweeps were working perfectly with plenty of blocking to clear the way for ball-carriers.

Bill Colona scored the first of Paoli's touchdowns, while "Reds" Byassee carried the second over into paydirt. Joe Townsend converted after the second touchdown with an accurate placement boot.

Sherwood's tally was the result of a long pass, snared by B. Murphy, a substitute back, in the end zone.

Good officiating made the game doubly enjoyable for the many fans in attendance.

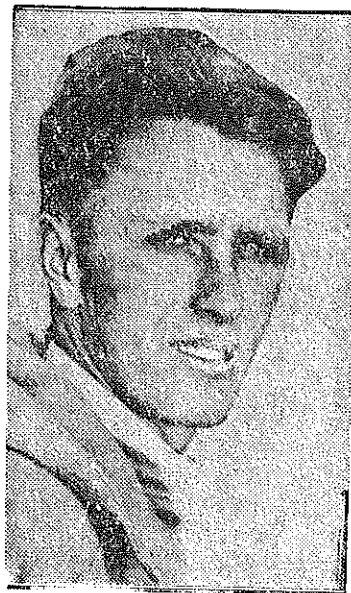

Men of Community Sponsor Banquet as Tribute to 1936 Team.

KILLINGER SPEAKS

More than 100 men of Easttown and Tredyffrin townships met in the High School building Tuesday evening at a dinner tendered the football squad of Tredyffrin-Easttown High School. This was the sixteenth annual banquet given the teams of the school by the men of the community, they having started just after the World War, when a half-dozen men who were interested in the school and the team gave them a small dinner on the stage of the auditorium.

The dinner, which was prepared by the domestic science department of the High School, left nothing to be desired and covered everything from "soup to nuts," including turkey with all its trimmings.

Wilbur B. (Dutch) Lehman, coach at Cheltenham High and a former T-E and F. & M. College football star, was toastmaster and in his own inimitable manner kept things moving from start to finish.

The list of guest speakers included men who have made their mark in the athletic world, both as players and coaches, and included Marty Brill, former star at Notre Dame, and now head coach at La Salle College; Glenn Killinger, of West Chester State Teachers College; Jack McAvoy, football coach at Ursinus College, Collegeville, and Chief Lone Star Deets, assistant to "Pop" Warner at Temple University.

The speakers all related many amusing and interesting experiences in their own football life and Mr. McAvoy paid a glowing tribute to Coach "Gerry" Smeigh, who played under him at Ursinus and twice was picked as an all-suburban guard.

Another speaker was Sergeant Howard S. Detwiler, the noted finger print expert of the Radnor township police, who is interested in all forms of athletics and particularly interested in Boy Scout work, in which he has been active in this community for several years.

Short addresses were made by William K. Groff, Supervising Principal of the Tredyffrin and Easttown township schools, and by "Gerry" Smeigh, the coach, who spoke in the highest terms of the loyalty and aggressiveness of the members of the squad.

This is Coach Smeigh's first year as coach at Berwyn, he having come here from Spring City High School in the fall, and he has made himself very popular, not only with the students of the school, but with the people of the community, who recognize not only his ability as a coach, but his high standards as a man. He is a native of Altoona, Pa., and a graduate of Ursinus College, where he was a star guard on the football team.

Letters were awarded the lettermen of the team by S. Paul Teamer, Principal of the High School, and noted football coach of bygone days, who was compelled to give up his coaching duties when his work as principal of the school took up all his spare time, not devoted to teaching. It was to Mr. Teamer's interest in the team, that these complimentary dinners were started, nearly 20 years ago, and he has taken an active interest in them ever since.

Letters were awarded William Colona (captain), John Byassee, Frank Cassidy, Raymond Costello, Patsy D'Ambrosio, Raymond Davis, Richard Dixon, Edward Hayes, Gordon Hickman, Robert Isinger, Frank Kelly, Mirth Lemma, Howard Kelly, Harry Melchior, Arthur Pennypacker, James Townsend, Louis Whitworth and Charles Baker (manager). A numeral was awarded Howard Tarr, freshman, who played a star game throughout the year.

Captain Colona was also presented with a gold football watch fob and he responded in a neat little speech.

Previous to the dinner, the letter men of the team held a meeting, and elected Patsy D'Ambrosio, popular backfield man, captain of next year's team. When notified of his election, at the dinner, he modestly acknowledged the honor, and promised to do everything in his power to have a winning team next year.

West Chester High Finished Third In Race

Trailed Phoenixville and Downingtown in County Title Scrap.

SECOND IN SCORING

Defeated by one county rival and tied by another, West Chester High School finished third in the race for county championship honors, this fall. Phoenixville High, undefeated in the county campaign and tied only by West Chester, is acclaimed as champion. Downingtown High, which was handed its only title series setback by Phoenixville, finished second in the race.

Spring City, though it played only Downingtown and North Coventry, is ranked fourth. The proteges of "Skip" Hunter defeated North Coventry and lost to Downingtown.

In the matter of point-scoring, Downingtown High paced the field with a total of 179, as compared with 44 for its opponents. West Chester was second in this department with 129 points to its credit and only 28 for its rivals. Spring City totaled 127 points and its opponents 79.

Phoenixville High produced only 107 points, but turned in the most impressive defensive record, by limiting its rivals to only six.

Berwyn Eleven Stopped After Four Straight Victories; Captain Colona Scores Lone Main Line Touchdown

Whatever goes up is sure to come down. A gritty gang of Tredyffrin-Easttown High footballers realize this today. For Berwyn, a mild sensation of the Suburban Conference championship race, met its Waterloo last Saturday at Downingtown.

Coach Gerry Smeigh's upper Main Liners were on the short-end of a 37-6 score in a game with Downingtown. That Berwyn lost was not so surprising, but the margin of Downingtown's superiority in the score certainly was a surprise.

The home eleven started fast, scoring twice in the first period, then duplicating the feat in the second and third, adding an extra point in the initial period. T-E was able to score only once, that coming in the last quarter.

Pepper Petrella and Johnny Cassenta were the big shots in Downingtown's triumph. It was Downingtown's third win in four conference starts. Petrella returned punts 75 yards and 70 yards to register his touchdowns. Cassenta got a brace of six-pointers and gained over 200 yards from scrimmage. Collins counted the other two touchdowns, one on a 40-yard romp off tackle.

Captain Bill Colnon's short plunge for a touchdown capped a 66-yard advance staged by Berwyn in the closing minutes.

BERWYN SPILLS RADNOR ELEVEN BY LONE SCORE

Poor Pass From Centre Starts Off Scoring Play; Is First Berwyn Win at Wayne in 14 Years

Isinger Recovers Ball and Despite Radnor Defense Colona Knives Way to Lone Score of Game; 7-0

A gritty little eleven from the upper reaches of the Main Line came down to Wayne yesterday afternoon, to extend the streak of misfortune which has dogged the Radnor High team. Coach Jerry Smeigh's Berwyn club, as scrappy a little club as you'll find in the entire Suburban Conference, handed the Red Raiders a 7-0 defeat yesterday on the losers' field.

The victory was first turned in by a Berwyn team over Radnor at Wayne in 14 long years.

Scoring a touchdown in the first period when a poor pass from centre gave them the game-winning "break", the team from the consolidated schools of Tredyffrin and Easton townships clung grimly to a 7-0 lead through to the bitter end.

The victory, their second in Radnor in as many years, was the first of the season for Berwyn. The setback marked the third in a row, each at the hands of Conference rivals, for Jules Prevost's helpless Raiders.

There was just one important break in the whole ball game, and this break cost Radnor the game. Early in the first period, with the ball resting on their own 25-yard line, Radnor's centre, Art Griffith, shot a hard, high pass back to "Whip" White. White had no chance to get the ball as it soared over his head. Before he could wheel and pounce on the oval, Bob Isinger, Berwyn guard, fell upon the ball to give Berwyn possession on the Radnor five-yard stripe.

Radnor Line Holds

Radnor's desperate resistance was almost classic. Three times they tossed back the lunging onslaught of the Berwyn combine. With the fourth down there was exactly one yard to go for the touchdown. Captain Bill Colona, taking the ball in the short buck position, knifed straight through the centre of the Raider defense to cross for the touchdown. Colona also booted the extra point from placement.

After this score Berwyn fought with everything they had to stave off the Raider thrusts. They could do almost nothing at all on the offense against their heavier rivals for the remainder of the game, only once threatening to add to their seven-point total. In the third period Patsy D'Ambrosia, a hard-driving, hard-hitting Latin husky, slamming through the centre of the Raider line, reversed his field and in a broken field simply fought his way forward 47 yards to the Radnor 21-yard mark.

Four plays late, Colona, ripping with everything he had, was beaten down inches short of a first down on Radnor's 12.

Outside of this one threat Berwyn was kept at bay by the excellent punting of Joe Monti, the Radnor leader. It wasn't until the end of the ball game that Buck Thornton started to match Monti kick for kick, so that Berwyn held its own with the Raiders in this department.

Radnor's one scoring threat came in the second quarter. Monti had been pushing the T-E players back, continuing with his long, high punts. Radnor got its one opening when Johnnie Byasse, Berwyn safety man, stepped out of bounds on the one-yard line after catching a punt.

Frank Kelley immediately treated over his own goal.

BERWYN DEFEATS HAVERFORD, 6 TO 0

Bob Thornton's third period touchdown gave Berwyn High a 6-0 triumph over Haverford High in a Suburban Conference game on the latter's field at Oakmont yesterday afternoon. The victory was Berwyn's fourth in five conference starts.

Thornton scored on a 15-yard sprint around left end to cap an 80-yard march in which he and Captain Bill Colona were consistent around gainers.

SELFINGER STARS

Baffled by a fine Berwyn defense, Pottstown was unable to make much headway against the Main Liners during the major part of the game.

Selfinger finally went over from the one-foot line after a 46-yard drive that featured a forward pass by George Daisy on the one-foot line. Selfinger ran back a Berwyn punt 65 yards for the second score, slipping through an eager Berwyn team.

Selfinger added the third six-pointer when he intercepted a Berwyn aerial and dashed 45 yards.
